

## CONDITIONS OF THIS PERMIT

Failure to comply with any of the terms and conditions of this permit may result in the immediate suspension or revocation of the permit. [36 CFR 1.6(h)]

1. The permittee is prohibited from giving false information; to do so will be considered a breach of conditions and be grounds for revocation:
2. This permit may not be transferred or assigned without the prior written consent of the Superintendent.
3. The permittee shall exercise this privilege subject to the supervision of the Superintendent or designee, and shall comply with all applicable Federal, State, county and municipal laws, ordinances, regulations, codes, and the terms and conditions of this permit. Failure to do so may result in the immediate suspension of the permitted activity or the revocation of the permit. All costs associated with clean up or damage repairs in conjunction with a revoked permit will be the responsibility of the permittee.
4. The permittee is responsible for making all necessary contacts and arrangements with other Federal, State, and local agencies to secure required inspections, permits, licenses, etc.
5. The park area associated with this permit will remain open and available to the public during park visiting hours. This permit does not guarantee exclusive use of an area. Permit activities will not unduly interfere with other park visitors' use and enjoyment of the area.
6. This permit may be revoked at the discretion of the Superintendent upon 24 hours notice.
7. This permit may be revoked without notice if damage to resources or facilities occurs or is threatened, notwithstanding any other term or condition of the permit to the contrary.
8. This permit is made upon the express condition that the United States, its agents and employees shall be free from all liabilities and claims for damages and/or suits for or by reason of any injury, injuries, or death to any person or persons or property of any kind whatsoever, whether to the person or property of the Permittee, its agents or employees, or third parties, from any cause or causes whatsoever while in or upon said premises or any part thereof during the term of this permit or occasioned by any occupancy or use of said premises or any activity carried on by the Permittee in connection herewith, and the Permittee hereby covenants and agrees to indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the United States, its agents, and employees from all liabilities, charges, expenses and costs on account of or by reason of any such injuries, deaths, liabilities, claims, suits or losses however occurring or damages growing out of the same.
9. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as binding the Service to expend in any one fiscal year any sum in excess of appropriations made by Congress or administratively allocated for the purpose of this permit for the fiscal year, or to involve the Service in any contract or other obligation for the further expenditure of money in excess of such appropriations or allocations.
10. If any provision of this permit shall be found to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this permit shall not be affected and the other provisions of this permit shall be valid and be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

### Park Specific Conditions

11. Caching Garbage and Equipment
  - All refuse/garbage must be removed from the mountain. Abandoning surplus gear, food, fuel, or wands is not allowed.
  - Caches must be stored so that wildlife may not access the contents (recommended: minimum 1 meter below snow surface) and identifiable to a party. Cache tags are provided by the park and recommended to be used on 1.5-2m tall wands. Caches without cache tags or labels will be removed from the glacier. Permanent caches are illegal.
  - All fixed lines and climbing protection must be removed upon descent.
  - Strain wastewater & dispose of liquid in a sump hole.
12. Preserve Natural Resources and Wildlife
  - Leave what you find. You may not remove any natural object from the park.
  - Below 6000 ft (200 m) travel & camp on durable surfaces. Don't feed or interfere with wildlife.
13. Human Waste Management
  - Use of the Clean Mountain Cans (CMC's) is mandatory on the West Buttress route. Use an existing urine spot whenever possible.
  - Below Camp 4 (14,200 ft) human waste must be collected in a CMC & removed from the mountain.
  - At or above Camp 4, human waste must be collected in a CMC & either returned to Talkeetna or deposited in a marked crevasse at Camp 4
  - Off the West Buttress, solid human waste must be tossed or shoveled away from the route
14. Practice Safe Climbing & Make Good Decisions
  - All parties are expected to be self-sufficient & to self-rescue and/or evacuate themselves should a member of the party become ill or injured.
  - If park staff provides emergency medical treatment to you or evacuates you, your climbing permit for the year is cancelled & you must descend.
  - If park staff treats a member of your party and/or evacuates a member of your party due to an emergency & determines that the situation was caused due to negligence, your climbing permit may be cancelled.
  - Solo climbing requires a separate application process & permit. If the rest of your expedition descends, you must descend as well & re-apply for a solo permit.
  - Interfering with park staff during search and rescue operations is prohibited.
15. Commercial Operations
  - All guided climbs must be conducted through an authorized mountain guide service licensed to guide on Denali & Mount Foraker.
16. Unmanned Aircraft are prohibited
